Charter Aircraft Maintenance

Jamie McCarthy, Director of Maintenance at Air New England answers two of the most common questions in regards to aircraft maintenance.

Q: What does a Director of Maintenance do?

A: A Director of Maintenance (or "DOM" in industry parlance) is responsible for the monitoring of the condition of the aircraft and ensuring that it/they are operating in a safe and "airworthy" condition. This is done through routine scheduled inspections and repairing on-condition discrepancies as they occur. Routine inspections are based on both calendar time and accrued flight time while the maintenance staff relies on the aircraft crews to report mechanical issues with the aircraft that need to be corrected in order to maintain airworthiness.

O: How do I know the aircraft is well-maintained?

A: The Federal Aviation Administration sets forth clearly defined basic standards for aircraft airworthiness. Manufacturers and operators design their maintenance programs around these rigorous standards and with the particular requirements of an aircraft type or component in mind. These programs are then carried out by highly trained and examined professional aircraft mechanics typically referred to as A&P (Airframe and Power-plant) technicians.
